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
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New City Choir

PE Kits





At New City Primary School we value the role of Physical Education (PE) in the promotion of health, co-ordination and well-being. We employ a range of experts to support our pupils' acquisition and development of skills in a variety of sports.

In order for PE lessons to be engaging all pupils must wear the correct PE kit for health and safety reasons. The kit is a white t-shirt or polo shirt and black or blue bottoms. Pupils should have plimsolls for indoor PE and dark- coloured trainers for outdoor sessions. We cannot allow pupils to participate in P.E lessons without the correct kit. Please try to ensure that your child has the correct kit.

Reading



Reading at home is a fantastic chance for your child to develop not only the confidence to read out loud and with expression, but to practice their comprehension skills. It would be very useful for your child to read a book of their choice (a new book is sent home from school each week!) out loud to you. You can help by listening to your child read out loud, helping them sound out unfamiliar words and asking them questions such as: "What do you like about this story? Why?" or "How is the character feeling? How do you know?" Please encourage your child to read a variety of texts-it could be a article, poetry, or information books. Thank you for your support!
