Fair Play House








This week some of children went to Fair play house an activity centre. They had a great time enjoying a number of different activities such as Low ropes and Zip wires!

Stitch and his friend Henry Oaf live in a large castle with the Professor. They haven't seen the Professor for 328 days because he told them he was not to be disturbed. When the Professor's nephew and his ward Alice arrive to visit, Stitch and Henry Oaf realise that they are only seen as experiments, or monsters, and they must escape the only home they've ever known. But where or who would welcome such 'monsters'? slightly younger children, provides a lot to think about and to feel – most importantly empathy. It is for confident readers, or a whole class read, and should leave readers considering how they might treat strangers, or people who look different to them. Note: death is discussed.
