History & Geography	Music	PSHE
In History, the children will be investigating and understanding the concept of being well known or famous. The children will be creating a chronological time line of significant people and how they have impacted society. After half term, in Geography, the focus of our topic will be the countries within the United Kingdom. The children will be able to name and identify characteristics of the four countries and capital cities of the United Kingdom.	The children will be learning a number of songs and through singing games they will be listening and appraising them. The children through solo singing will be able to identify changes in pitch. The children will also build on these skills after the half-term, when they look at tempo and time signatures through identifying the tempo in music and recognising and showing if music is in a 2 or 3 time.	The children will describe the characteristics of a positive community. They will consider how their actions may affect others in the community, children will focus on their own identity. They will recognise their strengths and weaknesses and consider what may influence their identity. They will also learn about stereotypes and the negative effect they can have on an individual's identity, as well as ways to stand up for themselves and others.
PE	Religious Education	Art & DT
In Art and Design during Autumn 1 the children will learn about the critically acclaimed artist Pablo Picasso and his portraits such as "Woman in a Hat with Pom Poms and a Printed Blouse". The children will learn about Picasso's cubist style which breaks up subjects into different shapes at different angles. They will also create their own Picasso inspired portrait of Queen Victoria that links to their learning about significant people in History. Later in Autumn 2, the children will create a mixed media stained glass window symbolising the Christian style. The children will make learning links with Religious Education and gain an understanding of how art is influenced by people and their beliefs.	In RE we will be discussing the topic 'Why do people celebrate festivals?' Children will gain an understanding of world religions and compare them. In the first half term, children will focus on the Kwanza and how this is celebrated in America to honour universal African heritage and culture. In Autumn 2, the children will discuss how special foods and fasting helps people with their faith.	In the first half-term, the children will be studying Balancing and Evasion skills. This will be taught through gymnastics (apparatus work) and basketball. In gymnastics, the children will develop shapes and partner balances accurately and combine and perform skills more fluently and effectively in games. In the second half-term the focus will be on sequences and evasion skills. This will be taught through street dance and football.
